For some people, thriving might mean a new career. We help people with that. For another person with a lifelong disability, that might mean learning life skills and working toward independence. We help people with that.

For others, it means receiving intensive therapies after a stroke or brain injury. No matter the barriers someone faces, Goodwill can help.

What we can be crystal clear about is where we are headed and what it will mean to our employees and those we serve. Our goal is to help bring 10,000 households into stability in Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont by 2027. We are making great headway, and are excited about our learnings along the way.

Workforce

Our programs help people get the job training and careers they need to support themselves and their families.

Our model is a robust team approach. These teams have specialized members who focus on each part of a person's life, but work together to provide a more holistic approach to support.



Healthcare



Our Healthcare programs serve people affected by a disability or brain injury. We operate two NeuroRehab clinics, community supports for adults with disabilities, and staffed residential homes.

Stores

Our stores keep millions of pounds of stuff out of local landfills each year and offer a great reuse buying option to people in our community at affordable prices. The stores also provide stable, flexible jobs for folks for whom it might be the first job or the fifteenth.



Cleaning

Goodwill's green cleaning services provide high quality cleaning to businesses in our communities while offering high-wage jobs to adults with disabilities.

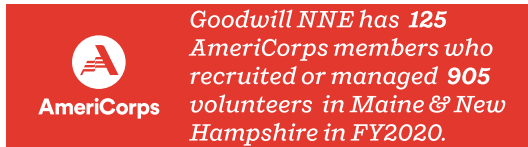




Goodwill assisted **198** young people with skills and job training, work experience and intensive career services.

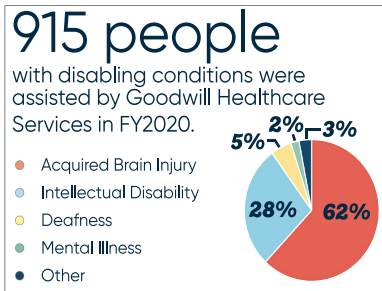

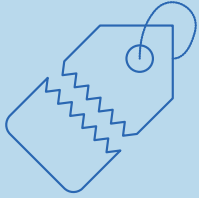
In FY20, Goodwill NNE diverted 50.5 million pounds of stuff from landfills in Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont. If you loaded tractor trailers with all of that stuff, the line of trucks would stretch more than 20 miles.





Stores

More than 2,000 items are added to each of our 30 stores' shelves every day, all at affordable prices.



In addition to our 30 stores across northern New England, Goodwill refurbishes electronics such as laptops, gaming systems, phones and more. We also make wiping cloths from unsold shirts.

Donated items stay in Goodwill stores for a few weeks, then go on sale at 50% off, then to \$1 per item, then to a "fill a bag" promotion. Remaining unsold items are then taken to a **Goodwill Buy the Pound** outlet store. This keeps our shelves fresh while being as sustainable as possible.

- Housewares

WHAT SHOULDN'T I DONATE?

When people "donate" trash it hurts our programs. We don't accept anything broken, stained or otherwise soiled. Please don't drop off:

- Baby furniture or car seats
- Tires, batteries, gasoline, motor oil
- Paint, lightbulbs, flammable gases
- Mattresses, box springs, water beds or water bed frames
- Guns, bullets or explosives
- Organs, pianos, large desks
